So that The New York Public Library may provide an atmosphere conducive to appropriate use of its services and facilities, the public is required to comply with the Library rules and regulations listed below:

Rules and Regulations

- Users of the library must respect the rights and privileges of all other users.
- Smoking is prohibited in library buildings, but only in open areas and law rooms.
- Language profanity is prohibited. Contact will be reported in compliance of applicable law or, in case of the following, many of which are violations of criminal or civil codes of law:
 - Creating public disturbance, including disruptive noise.
 - Obscene and/or abusive language or gestures.
 - Harassing or disturbing behavior.
 - Marking, drawing, or altering any books, maps, posters, displays, film, manuscripts, computer, or other library property.
 - Smoking.
 - Smoking, using e-cigarettes, or pipes of any kind. This rule does not apply to guests who are part of a program or activity sponsored by the library.
 - Playing video or tape games, playing card and board games, and other recreational activities.
 - Leaving any library property, i.e., using or removing any books, maps, or any other materials.
 - Intimidation, harassment and other forms of behavior leading to suspension of access.
 - Disruptive use of any equipment, including public wi-fi and library premises.
- Users of the library are required to respect an acceptable standard of personal hygiene. Indeed, clothing or personal effects or appearance that do not meet this standard when persons of the library is inappropriate.
- Books and materials must be handled with care and returned to the library.
- The resumption of food or beverages within the library is prohibited.
- Tools and/or staff are permitted to enter non-public areas of the library.
- All library materials must be changed out or maintained with regularity and frequency before being taken from library premises.
- All library materials, brochures, printed handouts, booklets, maps, etc., are subject to change without notice and may be used in the library.
- Library staff and security officers may, at any time, request users to show their library cards or other appropriate identification for purposes of identification.
- As a result, other than meeting persons with authorization, are not permitted in library buildings.

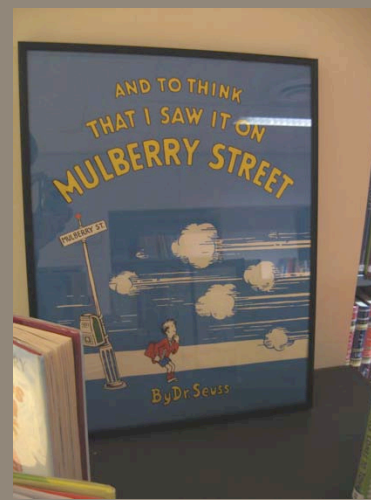

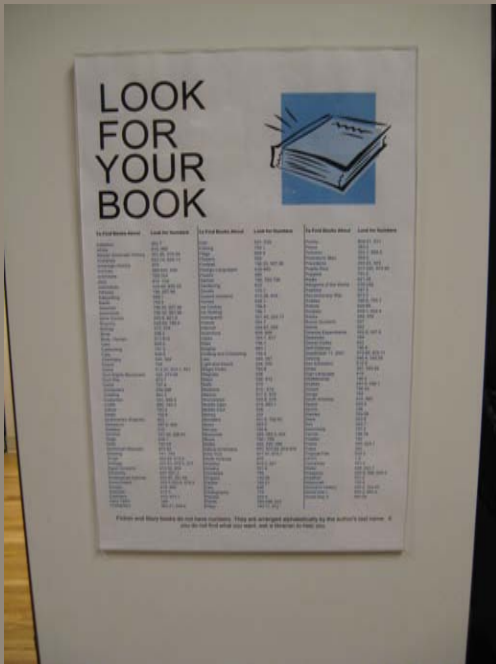


1ST - TOP FLOOR



CHILDREN'S FLOOR 1ST FLOOR DOWN

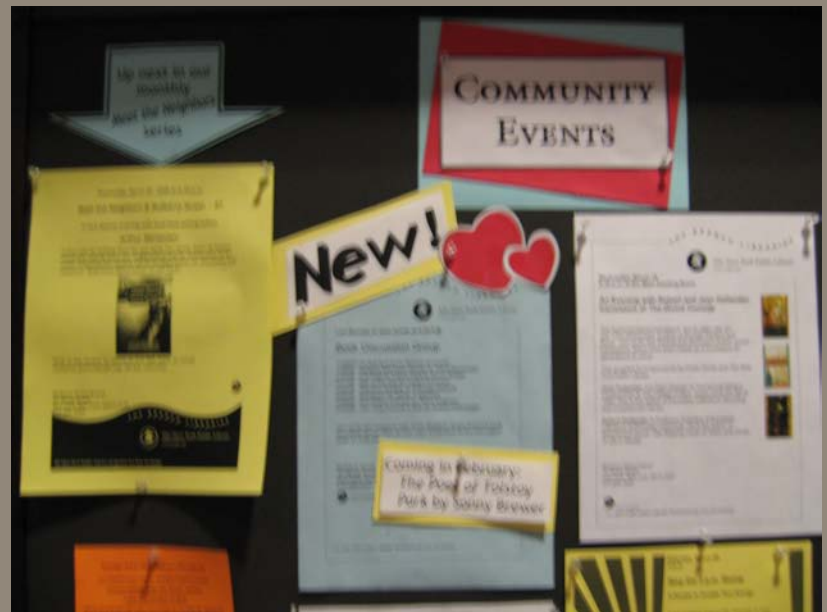




BOTTOM FLOOR - 2ND FLOOR DOWN
